## GUILFORD COLLEGE

Guilford College was founded in 1837 as New Garden Boarding School by the Religious Society of Friends (Quakers). In 1888, the academic program was greatly expanded and the school became a four-year college. Nationally, Guilford is one of the oldest co-educational institutions and is among only 13 Quaker-founded colleges.

Guilford strives to train responsible and enlightened leaders. Its method is the liberal arts, viewed not as a static body of knowledge but as a stimulus to intellectual and spiritual growth. Liberal education requires an atmosphere of academic and personal freedom, founded on intellectual and moral responsibility, and a commitment to ethical values and human beings.

Through the years Guilford has continually sought new methods of challenging students, bringing them into contact with vital ideas and experiences, and helping them arrive at their fullest potential as individuals and as members of society.

*The Strategic Plan for Guilford College 2005-2010: Creative Leadership for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century*, adopted in the fall of 2004, affirms the college's commitments to practical liberal arts education and lifelong learning and reaffirms Quaker values, diversity and community. Several key components of the plan have been adopted, including balancing the budget for fiscal year 2006 with a five percent endowment spending rate and the appointment of the college's first ombudsperson.

Guilford's 2,682 students hail from across the United States and many countries. The student-faculty ratio is 16:1 and nearly 90 percent of the faculty hold terminal degrees. In addition to traditional age and adult students, an academically select group of high school students study on campus.

The athletic complex is one of the finest among small colleges in the Southeast and includes the Ragan-Brown Field House, Armfield Athletic Center (football/lacrosse stadium), swimming pool, eight tennis courts and seven playing fields. The college has recently upgraded its weight and cardio rooms and locker rooms.

Guilford is one of five higher-education institutions in Greensboro, a city of 230,000 and a hub of cultural and sports activities in the northern piedmont region of North Carolina.

## GUILFORD ADMINISTRATION



**Kent Chabotar**  
President

**Kent John Chabotar**, a distinguished higher education administrator, faculty member and scholar, is in his fifth year as president and professor of political science at Guilford College. He was appointed July 1, 2002.

In his first two years at Guilford, Chabotar led the college in a widely participative strategic and long-range planning process for 2005-2010. He also guided the college toward a goal of a truly balanced budget by fiscal year 2006, worked to make communication processes more open and engaged with a broad range of college constituents. In addition to his administrative role, he teaches a public policy and administration class one semester each academic year.

Chabotar has more than 30 years of higher education teaching and administrative experience. He was vice president for finance and administration and treasurer at Bowdoin College in Brunswick, Maine, from 1991-02. He has been on faculty at Harvard University, the University of Massachusetts-Boston and Michigan State University.

He has been a member of the faculty of the Harvard Institutes for Higher Education since 1983, teaching a variety of summer executive programs, including the Institute for Educational Management and Seminar for New Presidents. In addition, he taught at the Getty Leadership Institute on Museum Management at the University of California at Berkeley from 1987-2003 and began teaching at the Getty Center in Los Angeles, Calif., in 2004.

Chabotar graduated magna cum laude from St. Francis University in Loretto, Pa., in 1968 with a bachelor of arts degree in political science. He earned his master of public administration degree with distinction and doctor of philosophy degree in public administration from the Maxwell School of Citizenship at Syracuse University in 1969 and 1973, respectively.



**Marion Kirby**  
Athletic Director

**Marion Kirby** enters his fifth year leading the Quakers' 16-team varsity athletics program. He succeeded **Mike Ketchum '78**, who was Guilford's head football coach from 1991-2004. Guilford's athletic department has enjoyed facility improvements, added three teams and restored another in Kirby's tenure.

Kirby came to Guilford from neighboring Greensboro College where he coached the Pride's football team in its first five years. He served as head football coach at Page High School in Greensboro where he compiled 219 wins and four state 4-A titles in 23 seasons on the sidelines. The Greensboro News & Record listed Kirby among the Triad's most important sports figures of the 20<sup>th</sup> century.

A native of Hickory, N.C., Kirby graduated from Lenoir-Rhyne in 1964 and played four years as an offensive lineman and place-kicker for the Bears' football team. Kirby serves as the North Carolina Coaches Association (NCCA) executive secretary and played in the NCCA's East-West All-Star Game in 1960. He is also a member of the Greensboro Sports Commission's Board of Directors.

## HEAD COACH STEVE KACZMAREK



**Steve Kaczmarek** enters his third year as the Quakers' women's swimming coach, but has 33 years of aquatics coaching and administration experience. He arrived on campus during the summer of 2004, but started recruiting for Guilford in December 2003 while completing his tenure as the Natatorium Supervisor and Aquatic Director for the Corpus Christi (Texas) Independent School District (CCISD), as position he held since 2000.

Before assuming his administrative role, Kaczmarek coached high school teams in the CCISD from 1984-2000. He coached seven national junior olympic qualifiers, two senior national qualifiers, three high school All-Americans, and 16 all-state swimmers. Kaczmarek received regional and district coaching honors for his work at Carroll H.S. and Kingsville H.S. His teams won 28 district titles, one regional championship, and enjoyed a 10<sup>th</sup>-place finish at the Texas high school state meet.

A 1975 Texas Tech graduate, Kaczmarek worked with the school's swimming team under coach Jim McNally and earned his bachelor's degree in physical education and health (curriculum and instruction). A member of San Antonio College's swimming team from 1970-72, Kaczmarek is a member of the American Swimming Coaches Association and has a lifetime membership with the Texas Interscholastic Swimming Coaches Association. He has been certified as a USA Swimming coach for 18 years.

## 2006-07 OUTLOOK

Head coach **Steve Kaczmarek** embarks on his third year at the helm of the Quakers' women's swimming team with high expectations. He returns 11 letter winners from a team that posted a 3-6 mark 2006. The squad set new school standards throughout the 2005-06 season, culminating with 13 school records set at the season-ending 2006 Atlantic States and Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) championships in Radford, Va. Kaczmarek wants to build on the solid foundation established during the team's first two seasons.

Guilford placed ninth out of 12 teams in the Atlantic States competition and sixth out of seven in the ODAC a year ago. The Quakers finished 11 points behind ODAC-rivals Hollins and Sweet Briar in the meet.

Kaczmarek was pleased with how the team improved throughout the year. He expects it to be much improved in 2006-07.

Guilford looks to overcome the loss of 2005-06 team Most Valuable Swimmer **Dana Putney**, who is sidelined for the season with an injury, and All-ODAC Lauren Truelove. However the Quakers still return a strong group of swimmers, including **Kate Talbot** at butterfly and freestyle, **Maddie Winters** at individual medley and backstroke, **Amanda Ohlert** and **Genevieve Holmes** at freestyle, and **Elena Soliz** at breaststroke. These student-athletes posted Guilford's top-five times in 16 of the 18 individual or relay events during 2005-06.

The Quakers dive into 2006-07 with nine first-year swimmers. "Building a new program has been exciting and challenging. Now our goal is to improve and gain more leadership with each coming year," Kaczmarek said. He points to this year's incoming class as his strongest and deepest to date and is confident the Quakers' nine newcomers will add depth and push the experienced student-athletes. The blend of talent should help the Quakers be more competitive within the ODAC.

The Quakers start preparing for 2006-07 in early September with strength training and stroke analysis, building their foundation for more strenuous training during the dual-meet season. Guilford opens the year on the road at Catawba for a relays meet, before coming home to host an ODAC tilt against Hollins. "The meet in late October will be a great tune up before we begin our conference and dual-meet schedule," Kaczmarek said. Guilford travels to Lexington, Va. for a dual meet with ODAC-powers Washington and Lee and Randolph-Macon in early November. The Quakers host dual meets with Randolph-Macon Woman's and Greensboro in November and Sweet Briar and Catawba in January. The season culminates with the three-day conference championship meet in mid-February.

## GREENSBORO, NC

Situated one hour from the mountains of western North Carolina, and three hours from the Atlantic Ocean, Greensboro is a culturally rich community where colleges and universities thrive in the heart of North Carolina's Piedmont Triad Region. With a population of over 230,000, the city is a major center of commerce and employment large enough to provide the sophistication of an urban center, yet small enough to offer a family-friendly atmosphere. In addition to Guilford College, Greensboro is home to North Carolina A&T State University, The University of North Carolina at Greensboro, Bennett College, Greensboro College and Guilford Technical Community College (GTCC).

Proud of its rich heritage and prosperous business community, the city has a deep history in business and manufacturing that is supported by the transportation infrastructure of the Piedmont Triad International Airport and the Federal Express cargo hub, scheduled to open in 2009. Greensboro is well-known for its large, diverse, and well-educated work force.

## GUILFORD COLLEGE POOL



Guilford practices and competes on campus in the Guilford College Pool, which is part of the College's Physical Education (PE) Center. The pool runs 25 meters in length with six lanes and newly installed starting blocks. The facility received extensive renovations in 2005, worth an estimated \$85,000.

The PE Center is a \$4-million complex that was dedicated in 1980. In addition to the pool, the P.E. Center houses the Ragan-Brown Field House, locker-room facilities, rooms for nine of Guilford's teams, and a fully equipped training room that was upgraded and expanded in 2004.

## OLD DOMINION ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

Guilford became an official member of National Collegiate Athletic Association (Division III) and the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) in September 1991 after a long and successful affiliation with the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA).

The ODAC began operations in 1976 with eight charter members competing in 10 sports. Today, the ODAC boasts 14 members and sponsors championships in 22 sports. Guilford joined the league in swimming in 2004 and Emory & Henry entered the league in 2005.

Washington and Lee captured its 13th consecutive ODAC women's swimming title in 2006. Washington and Lee also won the Atlantic States Championship, which runs concurrent to the ODAC meet.
