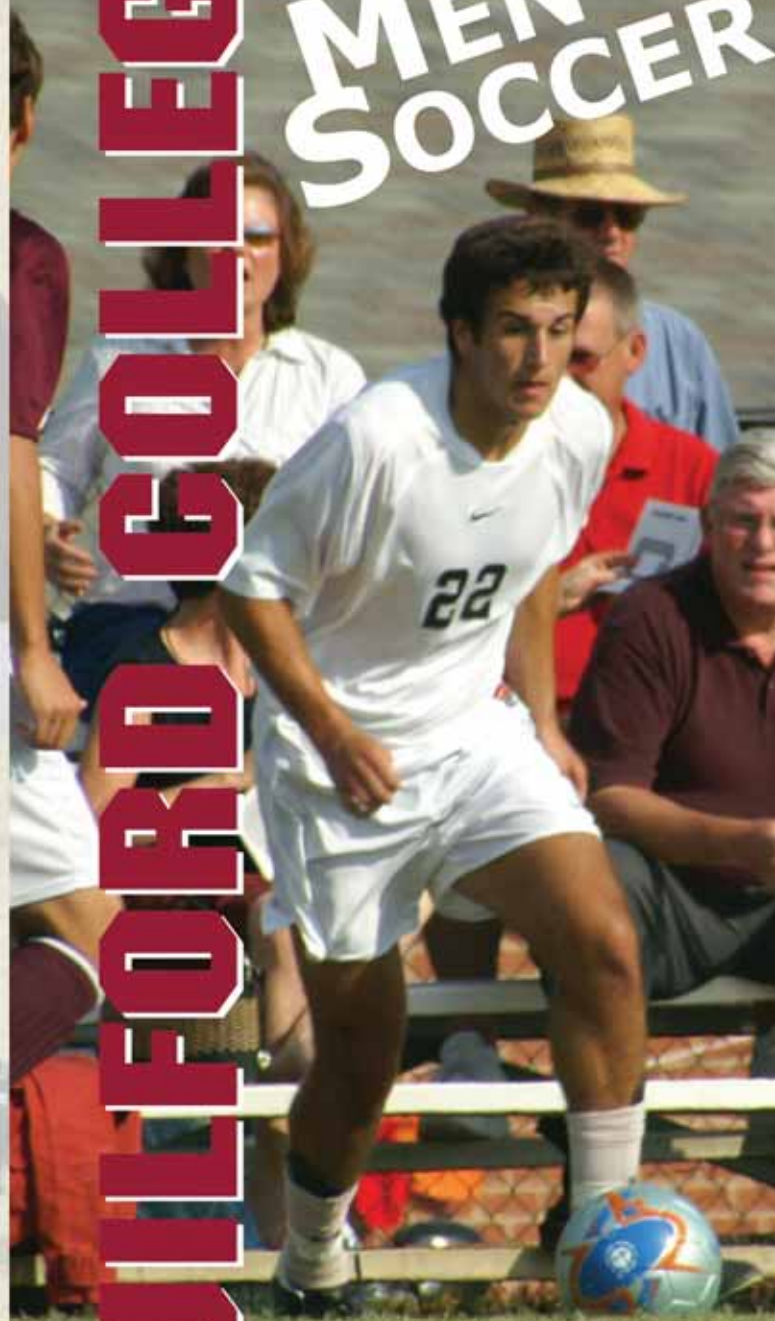

## GUILFORD COLLEGE

Guilford College was founded in 1837 by members of the Religious Society of Friends - the Quakers. It is the third-oldest coeducational college in the United States and the only Quaker-founded college in the South. A stop on the Underground Railroad, Guilford was one of only a few colleges in the South to remain open throughout the Civil War.

Today, Guilford ranks among the top four-year, liberal arts colleges in the nation. The college is widely respected for its interdisciplinary and multicultural curriculum, commitment to service learning and excellence in teaching. Guilford offers 41 academic majors and 52 concentrations.

The 340-acre campus is home to 2,682 full- and part-time students and 74 full-time faculty members, 90 percent of whom have terminal or equivalent degrees.

### HAWORTH FIELD

Guilford plays its home soccer matches on Haworth Field, located on the college's northwest corner. Since its dedication in 1981, Haworth Field has been significantly upgraded and ranks among the top fields in the Old Dominion Athletic Conference. In the summer of 2003, the field received new top dressing and other cosmetic improvements, including fencing. Guilford has hosted the North Carolina Girls Soccer Camp in each of the past four summers.

Haworth Field consists of two regulation soccer fields, a practice field, Guilford's varsity softball field, public rest rooms, seating areas, bench areas and a permanent scoreboard. The practice fields host intramural contests while the competition field is sodded with Bermuda grass and used exclusively by Guilford's varsity teams.

## OLD DOMINION ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

Guilford became an official member of National Collegiate Athletic Association (Division III) and the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) in September 1991 after a long and successful affiliation with the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA).

The ODAC began operations in 1976 with eight charter members competing in 10 sports. Today, the ODAC boasts 14 members and sponsors championships in 22 sports and is the second-largest multi-sport NCAA Division III conference in the country.

Virginia Wesleyan won the ODAC Tournament on penalty kicks, 4-2, after playing a scoreless tie with Eastern Mennonite in the final. The Marlins fell to York, 3-2, in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.

## COACHING PROFILES



### Head Coach Jeff Bateson

Jeff Bateson joined Guilford College's athletics staff in March as the Quakers' first full-time head men's soccer coach. The six-year head coaching veteran replaces Liam Behrens, who resigned in January when Guilford elevated the head men's soccer coaching position from part-time status.

A 1998 graduate of Alma (Mich.) College, Bateson (pronounced BATE-sun) spent the past two seasons as the head men's soccer coach at Tri-State University, an NCAA Division III institution in Angola, Ind. The Thunder improved from a 3-15-1 team in Bateson's first season to 6-13-1 last fall. Five of his Tri-State student-athletes garnered honorable mention All-Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) recognition and three were named to the MIAA Academic Honor Roll. In addition to coaching the men's soccer team, Bateson advised Tri-State's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) and taught in the school's Health, Physical Education and Sport Management department.

Bateson served as his alma mater's head men's soccer coach from 2000-2004. Alma went 39-31-7 in his four-year tenure and saw two students earn all-region honors. He directed four first team and seven second team All-MIAA selections. The Scots enjoyed their finest year under Bateson in 2000 when Alma went 12-6-2 and placed second in the MIAA with an 8-2-2 mark. In addition to his efforts on the field, Bateson raised funds for the construction of a new soccer game field advised Alma's SAAC for two years, and served as an assistant baseball and track and field coach.

An elementary education major, Bateson minored in math and Spanish and spent three years on Alma's SAAC. On the soccer field he garnered Third Team Umbro/National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Division III All-America honors as a senior midfielder. The Midland, Mich., product helped the Scots to the regional finals in Alma's first NCAA Tournament appearance and was the MIAA's Most Valuable Player in 1997. Bateson earned all-region and First Team All-MIAA honors in 1996 and 1997.

Upon graduation Bateson parlayed his college success into a short professional soccer career and entered the college coaching ranks. He played with the Premier Development League's Mid-Michigan Bucks (1997-98) and Colorado Comets (1999-00) before devoting himself fully to coaching. Bateson spent the 1998 and 1999 campaigns assisting his college mentor, Scott Frey, at Alma. The Scots went 30-9-3 with two NCAA Tournament trips in that time and reached the 1999 NCAA Division III semifinals. Bateson took over in 2000 when Frey accepted the head women's soccer post at Messiah, where he guided the Falcons to the 2005 NCAA Division III title.

Bateson earned his Premier coaching diploma from the NSCAA in 2006 and worked with the Citadel Futbol Club in Indiana. He has coached at a variety of soccer camps, including those hosted by Indiana University, the University of Michigan and UNC Greensboro.

## 2006 OUTLOOK

Jeff Bateson begins his first year as the Quakers' head men's soccer coach after taking over for career coaching wins leader Liam Behrens in March 2005. He inherits a squad that returns 16 letter winners and posted a 6-7-4 record in 2005. Last season marked the first time in seven years that Guilford missed out on the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) Tournament. After working with the veterans last spring, Bateson is excited about bringing a new attitude, structure and discipline to the soccer program.

Although the Quakers lost four seniors and two All-ODAC performers from last year, they return a strong core of players, including three-year starter **Zane Campbell** in goal. Bateson plans on creating an emphasis on the team's conditioning, strength, and athleticism. The 2006 roster may be shorter compared to last year's, but Bateson expects the squad's competitiveness to be much stronger.

Guilford returns three of its top-five scorers from 2005. Sophomores **Joe Rigert** and **Scott Meguid**, who produced 14 and 12 points respectively in 2005, are joined by junior **Mike McCaffrey** who tallied 10 points off of five goals last season. Four of the Quakers' veterans played in more than 10 games last season. Junior captain **Neil Meguid** and sophomore **Peter Deng** will be asked to take charge in the midfield, while sophomores **Robbie Fisher** and **Bryce Hunsucker** will anchor the defense. Guilford's two seniors, Campbell and midfielder **Ryan Huber** bring good game experience to the team. The Quakers' five first-year students were not totally recruited by Bateson, but he is confident they will add depth to his core of experienced veterans.

"The strongest part of our team is the defense," Bateson said. "We are fast and athletic, and we are going to utilize those abilities to push the ball up the field. We will be focusing on the fundamentals, working hard in practice and changing the attitudes, expectations, system and structure of Guilford soccer. Our focus will be on ODAC games as we play in a very competitive soccer region and must be at our best during these matches."

The ODAC coaches voted the Quakers last in the 10-team preseason poll. However a tough non-conference schedule should prepare the young Quakers for their challenging ODAC matches later in the year. Guilford opens the season in a pair of tournaments. First, the Quakers will travel to Maryville, Tenn., to play NAIA-member Tennessee Wesleyan and Division II Lincoln Memorial in the Nike Kick-off Classic. Next Guilford heads up to Lynchburg, Va., to tackle Ferrum and Mountain State in the Shellenberger Classic. The Quakers open their home schedule September 16 against defending ODAC champion Virginia Wesleyan at Haworth Field.
