- 1) *You must be available.* The Board must operate quickly and efficiently. In order to do so, the Board must be a high priority of its members. You must check your email every day and respond quickly to requests for board members to serve on hearings.
- 2) You *must* be willing and able to abide by all college policies as set forth in the Student Handbook.
- 3) You *must* be comfortable with enforcing the regulations as set forth in the Student Handbook.
- 4) You *must* be able to hold all matters brought before the Board and all decisions of the Board in strictest confidence.
- 5) You *must* have a GPA of 2.5 or better.

Please give the information above serious thought before applying. The position requires commitment and a clear understanding and willingness to enforce college policies.
