Guilford College was founded in 1837 by members of the Religious Society of Friends - the Quakers. It is the third-oldest coeducational college in the United States and the only Quaker-founded college in the South. A stop on the Underground Railroad, Guilford was one of only a few colleges in the South to remain open throughout the Civil War.

Today, Guilford College ranks among the top four-year, liberal arts colleges in the nation. The college is widely respected for its interdisciplinary and multicultural curriculum, commitment to service learning and excellence in teaching. Guilford offers 41 academic majors and 52 concentrations.

The 340-acre campus is home to 2,153 full- and part-time students and 74 full-time faculty members, 80 percent of whom have received doctoral or equivalent terminal degrees.

**HAWORTH FIELD**

Guilford plays its home soccer matches at Haworth Field, located on the college's northwest corner. Since its dedication in 1981, Haworth Field has been significantly upgraded and ranks among the top fields in the Old Dominion Athletic Conference. In the summer of 2003, the field received new top dressing and other cosmetic improvements, including fencing. Guilford hosted North Carolina Girls Soccer Camps in the summer of 2003 and 2004.

Haworth Field consists of two regulation soccer fields, a practice field, the varsity softball field, public rest rooms, seating areas, bench areas and a permanent scoreboard. The practice fields host intramural contests while the competition field is sodded with Bermuda grass and used exclusively by Guilford's varsity teams.

## OLD DOMINION ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

Guilford became an official member of National Collegiate Athletic Association (Division III) and the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) in September 1991 after a long and successful affiliation with the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA).

The ODAC began operations in 1976 with eight charter members competing in 10 sports. Today, the ODAC boasts 14 members and sponsors championships in 22 sports and is the second-largest multi-sport NCAA Division III conference in the country.

Tournament host Virginia Wesleyan defeated Washington and Lee, 3-1, in the 2003 ODAC Tournament final for its seventh league title. The Marlins claimed the ODAC's NCAA Tournament berth and advanced to the regional semifinals before falling to national runner-up Drew, 3-0. Guilford is 2-11 in 11 ODAC Tournament tilts.

## COACHING PROFILES



### Head Coach Liam Behrens

Liam Behrens starts his school-record eighth season as Guilford's 11<sup>th</sup> head men's soccer coach one win shy of the school's coaching wins record. He tied the mark last season in the ODAC Tournament victory over Bridgewater.

After assisting the Quakers in 1995 and 1996, he assumed head-coaching duties in 1997 and transformed the team from an also-ran into a contender. Behrens inherited a program that won 11 games from 1993-96 and two seasons later guided Guilford to nine wins. In 2002 the Quakers went 11-6-2, their best season since 1986, and reached the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) Tournament semifinals for the first time in school history.

In seven seasons, Behrens has a 52-74-5 record and has coached nine players to 15 all-conference honors, including **Tim Imafidon '04**, a 2003 NSCAA Third Team All-American and a four-time All-ODAC pick. Imafidon and teammate **T.J. Muse '04** earned All-South honors in 2002 and 2003.

Behrens began his college coaching career in 1989 at his alma mater, Virginia Commonwealth. The Long Island, NY, native earned a soccer scholarship and played four years for the Rams. He graduated in 1988 with a bachelor's degree in physical education and the school's career assists record (21). Behrens received performance and academic all-star recognition from the Sun Belt Conference and Virginia Sports Information Directors in 1986 and 1987.

Behrens played professionally in the American Indoor Soccer Association, the Major Indoor Soccer League and the United Systems of Independent Soccer Leagues (USISL) from 1989-97.

A vice president of the YMCA of Greensboro, Behrens holds a Class-C coaching license from the U.S. Soccer Federation. He and his wife, Lisa, reside in Greensboro.



### Assistant Coach John Hatchett

John Hatchett enters his third year on Guilford's staff. He joined the Quakers in 2002 and has helped them to consecutive ODAC Tournament semifinal berths. Hatchett assisted the boys' soccer team at Wesleyan Academy in High Point, NC, for two years and also coached with the Piedmont Soccer Alliance. He played professionally with three teams from 1997-2000, including the A-League's Cincinnati RiverHawks. Hatchett played two years and earned his bachelor's degree in corporate fitness from South Carolina Spartanburg in 1997.



### Assistant Coach Tim Imafidon

Tim Imafidon starts his first season as an assistant coach for his alma mater. The school's career goals leader, Imafidon graduated in May, 2004, with degrees in health science and biology. He earned National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) / adidas Third Team All-America honors and was a three-time NSCAA all-region performer. A Raleigh, NC, native, Imafidon scored 29 goals and nine assists in 54 career matches. He led the Quakers in scoring and earned All-ODAC honors in each of his four seasons with the team. Imafidon also received the English Athletic Leadership Award, Guilford's highest athletic honor, and was named the school's Best Senior Student-Athlete.

## 2004 OUTLOOK

While Guilford graduated four senior all-conference student-athletes from last year's 10-8-1 club, don't shed too many tears for the Quakers just yet. Coach **Liam Behrens** starts his eighth season on Guilford's sidelines with high hopes for the 15 letter winners returning from last year's Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) Tournament semifinalist.

Guilford will unquestionably miss the experience, skill and athleticism of **Tim Imafidon '04**, **Ampofo Darko '04**, **T.J. Muse '04** and **Noam Sorek '04**, who combined for 70 percent of Guilford's 2003 goals. Despite the loss of so many skilled and experienced players, Behrens says the Quakers can contend for the ODAC crown. He notes the skill of returning all-conference senior midfielders **Darriel Cannon** and **Brett Ralls** and points to the experience of seven seniors.

Look for the Quakers to maintain their 3-5-2 formation, but expect a more defense-oriented and technically skilled team as it compensates for loss of Imafidon and Darko. Behrens also hopes Quakers will apply more defensive pressure on the ball, which will require more players off the bench. A solid back line should minimize the pressure on the goaltender, which will be determined during preseason workouts among three players.

Here's a breakdown of Guilford's team by position:

**FORWARD:** Behrens looks forward to watching seniors **Steffen Schollaert** and **Matt Feraci** work together. Schollaert ranked third on the team with 16 points in his first season after transferring from the College of Charleston. Behrens says Feraci, who played at Appalachian State last year, is a sound target player who plays well with his back to the goal. Sophomore forward **Andres Miranda**, last year's Most Improved Player, enjoyed a solid spring and should find some minutes up front.

**MIDFIELD:** The Quakers are varied and experienced in the middle of the park with Ralls and Cannon. Ralls returns for a fifth season after receiving a medical redshirt for the 2001 campaign. Cannon earned Second Team All-ODAC honors last season and is one of the team's fastest and most versatile players. Senior **Greg Hinkle** could also play in the middle along with freshman **Mike McCaffery**.

Hinkle also has starting experience on the flank, as does Cannon and classmate **Bo White**. While the veterans have the edge in experience, Behrens likes talent of sophomore transfer **Thomas Sangster** and rookie **Greg Haver** of nearby High Point, NC.

**DEFENSE:** After sitting under the tutelage of Muse, a two-time all-region pick, sophomore **Greg Hampson** looks to become the next in a line of talented Guilford sweepers. Senior **Marcus Bowers** started 13 games as an outside defender last year and returns along with junior **Lenny Niedosik**.

**GOALKEEPER:** Sophomore **Zane Campbell** and junior **Matt McCall** split time between the pipes last year, but neither netminder especially distinguished himself. Behrens anticipates excellent competition between Campbell, McCall and newcomer **Andrew Allison**, a transfer to Guilford from NCAA Division II Concord (WV).

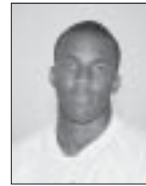
