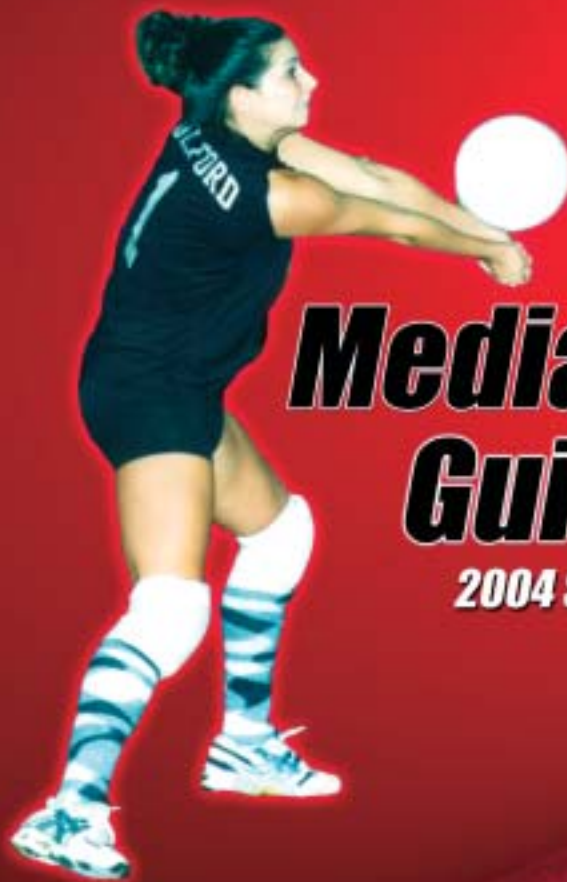

Hege Library

Guilford College was founded in 1837 by members of the Religious Society of Friends - the Quakers. It is the third-oldest coeducational college in the United States and the only Quaker-founded college in the South. A stop on the Underground Railroad, Guilford was one of only a few colleges in the South to remain open throughout the Civil War.

Today, Guilford College ranks among the top four-year, liberal arts colleges in the nation. The college is widely respected for its interdisciplinary and multicultural curriculum, commitment to service learning and excellence in teaching. Guilford offers 41 academic majors and 52 concentrations.

The 340-acre campus is home to 2,153 full- and part-time students and 74 full-time faculty members, 80 percent of whom have received doctoral or equivalent terminal degrees.

RAGAN-BROWN FIELD HOUSE

Guilford's volleyball team practices and plays its home matches in the Ragan-Brown Field House, which is part of the college's Physical Education Center. Named for Herbert and Elizabeth Ragan and Edwin and Dorothy Brown, the 2,500-seat arena features a fully-cushioned maple floor that was refurbished in the summer of 2004. The field house will host the 2004 Old Dominion Athletic Conference Volleyball Tournament. It also hosted the league's 1995 tourney.

Dedicated in 1980, the P.E. Center is a \$4-million complex that includes the field house, a 25-meter pool with separate diving well, locker rooms, classrooms, and a fully equipped training room. Over the summer of 2004, the center's weight and cardio rooms underwent a \$125,000 renovation and expansion.

OLD DOMINION ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

Guilford became an official member of National Collegiate Athletic Association (Division III) and the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) in September 1991 after a long and successful affiliation with the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA).

The ODAC began operations in 1976 with eight charter members competing in 10 sports. Today, the ODAC boasts 14 members and sponsors championships in 22 sports and is the second-largest multi-sport NCAA Division III conference in the country.

Washington and Lee won its seventh ODAC Tournament title last season with a 3-1 win over Bridgewater in the tourney final. The Generals advanced to the NCAA Division III regional semifinal round before falling to Emory, 3-0.

COACHING PROFILES



Head Coach Glenda Dellinger

Glenda Dellinger starts her second season as the Quakers' head volleyball coach. She became Guilford's third head volleyball mentor in January, 2003, after eight seasons at Lenoir-Rhyne. Her career record in nine seasons is 115-179.

A native of Winston-Salem, NC, Dellinger returned to Central North Carolina after guiding the NCAA Division II Bears to a 109-156 mark.

Her 2000 club compiled a 19-13 record, the school's best campaign since 1989. Lenoir-Rhyne enjoyed three straight winning seasons from 1999-2001 after nine straight losing years and saw seven student-athletes combine to win 12 all-conference commendations. Dellinger coached all-region performer Michelle Baity, a four-time first-team all-league pick and the Bears' only South Atlantic Conference (SAC) Freshman of the Year.

A veteran Junior Olympic club volleyball coach, Dellinger founded the Hickory Inspirational Spikers (HIS) Club in 1995 and led two teams to national tournaments. A member of the American Volleyball Coaches' Association and the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, she has completed USA Volleyball's Coaches Accreditation Program (CAP) I and II certification programs. Dellinger chaired the 2000-01 SAC Volleyball Coaches' Committee and voted on the weekly AVCA/NCAA Division II national poll in 1999.

As a senior at Ledford High School in nearby Thomasville, NC, Dellinger earned Most Valuable Player honors and helped the Panthers to their first state volleyball title in 1981. She continued her playing career at Catawba where she competed against Guilford in the Carolinas Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (CIAC). A team MVP, Dellinger earned All-CIAC and All-NAIA District 26 honors for Catawba as a senior in 1985. She graduated with a bachelor's degree in public recreation in 1986 and earned a master's degree in physical education from Alabama A&M in 1994. She served as the assistant volleyball coach at Alabama-Huntsville from 1992-94 and helped the Chargers to a 57-28 record in two seasons. Dellinger started coaching volleyball at Forbush (NC) High School in 1990.

The former Glenda Parrish, she married her husband, Bryan, in September, 2003. The couple lives in Kernersville.



Assistant Coach Jaime Kutz

Jaime Kutz (pronounced KOOTZ) joined the Quakers' staff in August, 2004, after graduating from High Point University with a bachelor's degree in fitness and training. A dean's list student, she received Millis Scholar-Athlete recognition in each of her four seasons and was a member of the Big South Conference's 2001 Honor Roll. Kutz played almost every position during her college career and was the team's starting setter as a junior.

A native of Fort Myers, FL, Kutz graduated from Riverdale High School where she was a two-time Lee County Athletic Conference honoree. She graduated with the school records for kills and digs in a match and season. Also a talented golfer, she helped her team to sixth place in the 1999 Florida 3-A State Tournament as well as district and conference titles. She was a team captain and Most Valuable Player in both sports. Kutz played two seasons with the USA South Volleyball Club in Naples, FL, where she helped the team to a 2000 regional title.

2004 OUTLOOK

Guilford starts its second season under head coach **Glenda Dellinger** with some important questions that will determine the squad's success in 2004. Questions provide opportunities and Dellinger looks forward to competitive and spirited preseason workouts. The questions should be answered in early season play as the Quakers develop their 2004 identity.

Six returners are back from last year's 6-23 club that narrowly missed the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) Tournament for the second time in the Quakers' 13 seasons in the league. Three regulars from last year's club graduated, including **A.J. Robertson '04**, the team's top offensive player.

Robertson received Guilford's Best Senior Student-Athlete Award and the ODAC's Scholar-Athlete prize. Setter Bethany Stubbs, a three-year starter, opted not to play volleyball as a senior.

Whoever plays setter will likely be new to the position. Fortunately, Dellinger added **Jaime Kutz** to the coaching staff to help train the ball handlers. Kutz, a 2004 High Point University graduate, was a converted setter herself and led the Division I Panthers in assists as a junior. The setter position is wide open entering preseason and Dellinger has also considered running a 6-2 formation with two setters.

Ideally, Guilford will run the swing offense as it provides an exciting and entertaining style of play. After a prolonged adjustment period, the Quakers picked up the versatile system and won four of their final eight matches. Dellinger hopes the momentum continues in 2004, but needs new players to fill the offensive vacancies created by graduation. While the newcomers adjust, look for veterans to lead a strong defensive effort.

Senior hitter **Mackenzie Parsio** is a top candidate to fill part of the void, although this marks her first season in Dellinger's system. Parsio, a solid athlete, started as a middle hitter in her first two seasons before spending last fall studying abroad. Hagerstown (MD) Community College transfer **Mandy Myers** also has college experience. A 6-2 junior, Myers is the Quakers' tallest student-athlete and teams with the 5-11 Parsio for a solid middle presence. Another newcomer, rookie hitter **Jessica Chapman**, could also play a prominent offensive role.

The Quakers' back line boasts the team's greatest depth and experience. Seniors **Kendra Harvey** and **Rhonda Rogers** have been defensive fixtures for the past three seasons. The pair brings enthusiasm and some experience as hitters. Juniors **Kaira Wagoner** and **Julie Squires** played their first Guilford volleyball seasons last year and have experience in Dellinger's system. Guilford's back-line veterans are solid servers, so look for the Quakers to serve aggressively.

Guilford expects to learn a lot when it opens the season in a tournament hosted by Maryville (TN). The Quakers have a couple weeks to adjust against nonleague opponents before beginning ODAC play September 17. Guilford's first goal is to return to the league tournament, which it hosts this season in the refurbished Ragan-Brown Field House. After that, Dellinger hopes for an enjoyable and healthy season that builds a solid foundation for future success.
