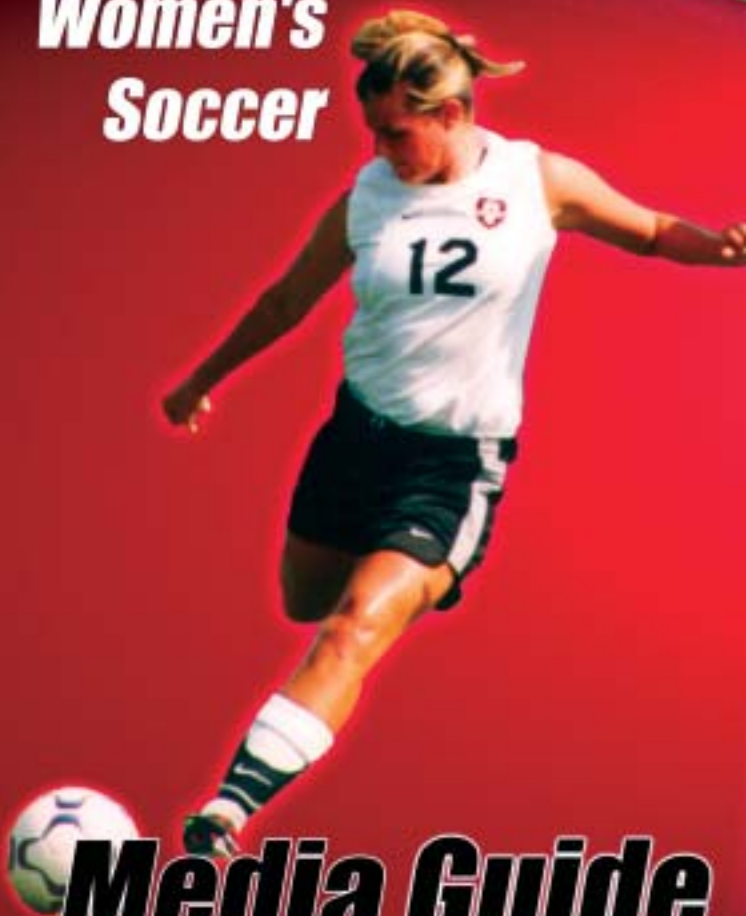

Guilford College was founded in 1837 by members of the Religious Society of Friends - the Quakers. It is the third-oldest coeducational college in the United States and the only Quaker-founded college in the South. A stop on the Underground Railroad, Guilford was one of only a few colleges in the South to remain open throughout the Civil War.

Today, Guilford College ranks among the top four-year, liberal arts colleges in the nation. The college is widely respected for its interdisciplinary and multicultural curriculum, commitment to service learning and excellence in teaching. Guilford offers 41 academic majors and 52 concentrations.

The 340-acre campus is home to 2,153 full- and part-time students and 74 full-time faculty members, 80 percent of whom have received doctoral or equivalent terminal degrees.

HAWORTH FIELD

Erin Mack '99

Guilford plays its home soccer matches at Haworth Field, located on the college's northwest corner. Since its dedication in 1981, Haworth Field has been significantly upgraded and ranks among the top fields in the Old Dominion Athletic Conference. In the summer of 2003, the field received new top dressing and other cosmetic improvements, including fencing. Guilford hosted North Carolina Girls Soccer Camps in the summer of 2003 and 2004.

Haworth Field consists of two regulation soccer fields, a practice field, the varsity softball field, public rest rooms, seating areas, bench areas and a permanent scoreboard. The practice fields host intramural contests while the competition field is sodded with Bermuda grass and used exclusively by Guilford's varsity teams.

OLD DOMINION ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

Guilford became an official member of National Collegiate Athletic Association (Division III) and the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) in September 1991 after a long and successful affiliation with the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA).

The ODAC began operations in 1976 with eight charter members competing in 10 sports. Today, the ODAC boasts 14 members and sponsors championships in 22 sports and is the second-largest multi-sport NCAA Division III conference in the country.

Washington and Lee captured the 2003 ODAC Soccer Tournament with a 2-1 win over Virginia Wesleyan in the final. Both teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament where Virginia Wesleyan avenged its ODAC Tournament loss with a 1-0 double-overtime win in the third round of the NCAA playoffs. Depauw eliminated the Marlins in a quarterfinal match determined by penalty kicks.

COACHING PROFILES



Head Coach Eric Lewis

After only two seasons as Guilford's head coach, **Eric Lewis** already stands third on the school's career coaching wins list with a 20-19-2 record. He has a 59-24-3 overall record in four seasons. His 2003 unit tied the school standard with 11 victories, including a record-setting seven Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) wins. The Quakers' eighth women's soccer coach, Lewis has coached

one all-region student-athlete, two all-state performers and three All-ODAC selections at Guilford.

Lewis began his second term with the Quakers in July, 2002 as head women's soccer coach. He assisted Guilford's men's squad in 1998 before coaching Louisburg's women's team in 2000 and 2001. Louisburg compiled a 39-5-1 record in his two seasons, which helped him earn a pair of Region X Coach of the Year prizes. The 2001 unit reached the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) District D finals and was ranked 12th in the final national junior college poll.

A native of Chapel Hill, NC, Lewis works extensively as an instructor and administrator with the North Carolina Girls Soccer Camp. He also has significant coaching experience at the high school level in North Carolina. Lewis coached the girls' varsity soccer team at Northern Durham High School in 2000 and was at East Chapel Hill High School the previous season. He assisted the state champion girls' team at Southwest Guilford in 1997 and has also made scholastic coaching stops at Northwest Guilford, McMichael and Jordan.

Lewis received a bachelor's degree in sport management from UNC Greensboro in 1996 and completed requirements for a bachelor's degree in history from High Point University in 1998. He also serves as Guilford's athletics department academic coordinator.



Assistant Coach Emily Johnson

Emily Johnson joined Guilford's staff in August, 2004 and will work primarily with the team's goaltenders. She spent the past two seasons assisting Greensboro College's soccer and lacrosse teams while serving as a residence hall director. Johnson coached Ferrum's soccer and lacrosse teams from 2000-02. She also filled in as Bentley's head women's soccer coach in 1999 and worked as a graduate assistant soccer coach and instructor at Cortland from 1995-98. A native of Shutesbury, MA, Johnson graduated from Ithaca College in 1995 and earned Second Team NSCAA All-America honors as a goaltender. She was a backup on the Bombers' 1991 NCAA Division III national championship team.

2004 OUTLOOK

Guilford wants to continue the improvement shown in each of coach **Eric Lewis'** first two seasons. In 2003 the Quakers tied the school's wins record with an 11-9 mark and posted the program's first victory over league-rival Roanoke. The team also set school standards for Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) wins (7-4) and single-season shutouts (8) on its way to fourth-place in the league standings.

The Quakers succeeded despite early-season injuries to 2002 ODAC scoring leader **Kimberly Mullen**, defender **Becky Craig** and midfielder **Chelsea Glover**. Mullen, a two-time Second Team All-ODAC pick, missed four games and played sparingly later in the season. She still managed 12 goals and two assists in limited action. The trio comprises three of the 20 letter winners back from the last year's squad. These student-athletes' healthy return plus the loss of only three seniors to graduation gives Guilford hope for joining the ODAC's upper echelon in 2004. Two transfers, sophomore **Jannah Carter** and junior **Kelly Robinson**, highlight the 13 new faces on the roster. Carter comes from Flagler, while Robinson played at Florida State in 1999.

Guilford placed fifth in the ODAC last year with 151 points, and looks improve that ranking in 2004. The forwards are led by Mullen and bolstered by senior **Flo Lance** and junior **Heather Ruggiero**, both honorable mention All-ODAC picks last year.

The midfield should be the Quakers' deepest position, led by sophomore **Jennifer Mundy**. Guilford's 2003-04 Best Undergraduate Female Student-Athlete, Mundy collected all-region, all-state and all-conference honors after leading the Quakers with 12 goals and four assists. A healthy Glover brings a strong physical presence to the midfield and is a key in transition. Freshman **Micki Boulineau** and sophomores **Emily Ott** and honorable mention All-ODAC pick **Rachel Gwin** round out the midfield.

The Quakers back line boasts speed at every spot. Craig returns to sweeper to improve a defense that placed eighth among the ODAC's goals allowed leaders. Sophomore **Diana Newman** and junior **Alissa VanZee-Phillips** return as starting defenders. Freshman **Maryam Benganga's** size and speed should aid the backs.

Junior **Danielle Brisotti** tends the goal after splitting time there last season. A two-year starter, she tied a school record with seven shutouts in 2002 and set the career shutouts mark (11) last year. Sophomores **Veronica Zych**, **Emmalee Morris** and rookie **Amber Hoppe** serve as understudies in goal.

The Quakers face a challenging schedule in 2004, including three games against 2003 NCAA Division III playoff participants. Guilford opens the season at Division I Wofford. The Quakers meet crosstown rival Greensboro October 19 at Macpherson Stadium, the site of the 2004 and 2005 NCAA Division III soccer semifinals and finals.
