### GUILFORD HOSTS EMORY & HENRY IN BID FOR .500 RECORD

**THE GUILFORD-EMORY & HENRY SERIES:** The Quakers and Wasps take to the gridiron for the 57th time today, which makes it the third-most played rivalry in Guilford history. The teams first met Sept. 20, 1930, with host Emory & Henry taking a 27-0 victory. The Wasps won the first six contests between the schools before Guilford claimed a 26-0 win in 1946.

Emory & Henry has won three straight games with Guilford and seven of the last eight. While the Wasps hold a 32-24 edge in the season series, Guilford has more wins against them than any other opponent in school history. Emory & Henry is 10-4 against the Quakers since Guilford joined the ODAC in 1991. Guilford holds a 16-10 edge in the games played in Greensboro.

Quarterback **Todd Woods** passed for three touchdowns and ran for a fourth in Emory & Henry's 49-34 win in last year's game in Emory, VA. The Wasps took advantage of five Guilford interceptions and returned one for a touchdown. The Quakers' **Micah Rushing** made 10 catches for 87 yards and a touchdown. Guilford quarterback **Chris Gammon** ran for 94 yards and passed for 298 yards and four touchdowns.

**EMORY & HENRY IN 2005 (1-9, 1-5 ODAC):** Emory & Henry is mired in its worst season since 1981. The Wasps opened with seven straight setbacks under first-year head coach **Don Montgomery**. Montgomery replaced Lou Wacker, who retired after 23 years in which he directed the Wasps to five NCAA playoff appearances and a league-record 11 ODAC titles. Montgomery came to Emory from Division III powerhouse Mount Union where he was an assistant coach for 27 years. The Wasps picked up their first win Oct. 29 with a 24-21 victory at Catholic. Washington and Lee defeated Emory & Henry last week, 45-7.

**WASPS OFFENSE:** The Wasps' Pro-I set averages a league-low 9.8 points and 228.8 total offensive yards per game. Junior quarterback **Todd Woods**, a three-year starter, has passed for over 6,000 yards in his career, including a school-record 3,058 yards in an All-ODAC season last year. Junior **Brennan Stewart** is the team's top receiver. He and classmate **Jerad Jackson** formed one of the ODAC's top receiving tandems in 2004, combining for 22 touchdown receptions. Junior **Andrew Hemp** has been the top running back and a favorite pass target.

**WASPS DEFENSE:** Opponents average 36.3 points and 429.1 offensive yards per game against Emory & Henry's 4-3 defense, which ranks only ahead of Guilford among the league standings. The Wasps have not given up fewer than 21 points in a game this season. Junior linebacker **Marshall Doss** ranks 25th in the nation and second in the ODAC among tackles for loss leaders. He also stands second in the league in tackles. Doss and senior teammate **Andrew Salyer** share the league lead in forced fumbles. Rookie safety **Brandon Creasy** is fifth in the league in tackles.

## QUAKERS DOWN CATHOLIC, 49-42, FOR THIRD STRAIGHT ODAC WIN

**LAST WEEK:** Guilford won its third straight game for the first time since 2001 with a 49-42 road victory over Catholic. The Quakers held a three-touchdown lead in the fourth quarter, but needed to hang on when Catholic scored two touchdowns, blocked a Guilford field goal and intercepted a pass in the end zone in the fourth quarter. A Devon White interception in the final minute preserved the win against the driving Cardinals.

**OFFENSIVE LEADERS:** Redshirt-freshman quarterback **Josh Vogelbach** (pronounced **VO-gul-BACK**) threw for a school record-tying five touchdowns for the fifth time in six games and set the Guilford standard with 582 passing yards. He set school and league marks with 45 completions in a record 72 attempts. Junior receiver **Chris Barnette** was his favorite target with an ODAC and school-record tying 17 receptions for a school-best 233 yards and three touchdowns. Junior receiver **Micah Rushing** caught nine passes for 119 yards and a score. He also threw a 24-yard touchdown pass to Barnette and ran for a two-yard score. Rookie wideouts **Kevin Vaughn** and **Danny Langston** added five catches apiece. Redshirt-sophomore receiver **Joe Joyner** had seven grabs for 92 yards and a touchdown.

**DEFENSIVE LEADERS:** The Quakers matched their season high with three interceptions, two by junior cornerback **Devon White**. His pick in the game's final minute stopped the Cardinals for the last time at the Quakers' 15-yard line. His first interception setup a Guilford score. Senior **Travis Boyd** made a team- and career-high 10 tackles. Junior linebacker **Eric Smallwood** saw his most extensive time at linebacker since week two and responded with a career-high seven tackles. Freshman cornerback **David Bonilla** and junior safety **Josh Sutton** also had career highs with seven interceptions. Junior defensive back **Josh Crowell** made a fourth-quarter interception and three tackles.

**SPECIAL TEAMS LEADERS:** Junior kicker **Travis Frazier** converted five of six point-after attempts and had a 31-yard field goal attempt blocked. He also punted twice for a 41.5 -yard average with a long kick of 49 yards. He placed one kick inside the Catholic 20-yard line. Senior **Travis Boyd** made five of his 10 tackles on special teams.

**BARNETTE, OFFENSIVE LINE EARN NATIONAL HONORS:** Junior receiver **Chris Barnette** earned his second D3Football.com Team of the Week commendation after his record-setting performance at Catholic last week. He was joined on the team by his offensive linemen: seniors **Corey Haase**, **Ian Kirwan**, **Jon Matthews** and freshmen **Andrew Parker** and **Kendall Wallace**. **Barnette** tied the school and ODAC standards with 17 receptions, which included a career-high three touchdowns. He totalled 233 receiving yards, also a school record and the third-best day in ODAC history. Guilford's offensive line yielded no sacks against a Catholic defense that entered the game with a league-leading 3.3 sacks per game average.

**VOGELBACH SETS NATIONAL FRESHMAN RECORDS:** Redshirt-freshman quarterback **Josh Vogelbach** broke the NCAA Division III record for touchdown passes in a season by a freshman Oct. 29 against Randolph-Macon. With 33 scoring tosses he broke the mark set by Mount Union's Bill Borchert in 1994. Last week **Vogelbach** broke Juniata's Greg Troutman national freshman records for completions, passing yards and total offense. **Vogelbach** needs 51 pass attempts to break Troutman's record of 464 set in 2001.

**Vogelbach** tied the NCAA Division III record for most two-point conversion scoring passes in a game (4) against Hampden-Sydney Sept. 24.

**GUILFORD ENJOYING BEST SEASON SINCE 1997:** The Quakers four victories this season match their most in a campaign since 2001 when Guilford won its last three games to finish 4-6 (3-3 ODAC). With a victory this afternoon the Quakers would post their most successful season since the 1997 club tied the school record with an 8-2 mark and shared the league title with a Guilford-best 4-1 ODAC mark.

**TWO QUAKERS WIN ODAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS:** For the first time since 1997, Guilford has had three student-athletes earn ODAC Player of the Week honors. Redshirt-freshman quarterback **Josh Vogelbach** became Guilford's first two-time winner in one season since **Danny Strelkauskas '98** did it in 1997. The rookie completed 26 of 42 passes for 334 yards and five touchdowns in the Quakers' Oct. 29 win over Randolph-Macon. **Vogelbach** also won the award for his 395-yard, five-touchdown performance in the Quakers' Oct. 1 win over Greensboro, which also earned him a spot on the *Football Gazette's* National Offensive Player of the Week list for NCAA Division III for the week ending October 2.

Junior receiver **Chris Barnette** was named the ODAC's Offensive Player of the Week for his efforts against Washington and Lee Oct. 22. He made 13 catches for 200 yards and two touchdowns in Guilford's win over the Generals.

**QUAKERS RANKED AMONG NCAA LEADERS:** As a team, Guilford ranks fourth in NCAA Division III through games of Nov. 5 with 354.3 passing yards per game. Redshirt-freshman quarterback **Josh Vogelbach** is fourth in total offense (355.9 yards per game) and 38th in passing efficiency (139.9). Junior receiver **Chris Barnette** enters the Emory & Henry contest ranked second among this week's NCAA Division III receptions per game leaders (9.7) and fourth in receiving yards per game (130.4). He ranks 37th in points per game (9.3). Junior receiver **Micah Rushing** stands 10th among receptions per game leaders (7.4) and 42nd in receiving yards per game (90.4). He also stands 35th in all-purpose yards per game (151.7) and 46th in kickoff returns (23.7). Junior punter **Travis Frazier** is 45th in the national rankings with a 37.9-yards per punt average.

**QUAKERS RANKED AMONG ODAC LEADERS:** Junior punter **Travis Frazier** leads the league with a 37.9-yards per punt average and leads the ODAC in PAT percentage (96.4%). Redshirt-freshman quarterback **Josh Vogelbach** has the ODAC's second-highest passing average (345.4 yards per game) and stands second in total offense (355.9). Junior receiver **Chris Barnette** ranks second in the ODAC with 9.67 receptions per game and fourth in receiving yards per game (130.4). Add in junior **Micah Rushing** (4th in catches, 5th in yards) and redshirt-sophomore **Joe Joyner** (8th in catches, 9th in yards), and the Quakers have three of the ODAC's top-10 leaders in receptions and receiving yards per game. **Rushing** is also ranked fourth in all-purpose yards per game (151.7) and sixth in kickoff return average (23.7). **Barnette** stands third among the league's scoring leaders (9.3 ppg).

On defense, junior defensive back **Devon White** ranks fourth in interceptions per game (0.44) and third in passes defended. Sophomore safety **Taylor Baker** ranks 10th in the league with 5.3 tackles per contest. Sophomore defensive end **Scottie Byrd** is fourth in tackles per loss per game (1.28), fifth in sacks per game (0.50) and shares the league lead with two forced fumbles. Redshirt-junior linebacker **Mario Paylor** shares the league lead with three fumble recoveries.

**ARMFIELD CENTER TO GET A MILLION-DOLLAR FACELIFT:** Guilford president **Kent Chabotar** announced a lead gift of \$1.1 million towards the renovation of the Armfield Athletic Center at halftime of Guilford's Sept. 10 game with Methodist. The gift from the Armfield Foundation and anonymous donors is designated to replace the spectator seating, press box and exterior walls of the stadium. The renovations should be completed by the start of the 2006 season, Guilford's 100th football campaign.

With endorsement from Armfield Foundation trustees, the college plans to raise additional funds for stadium improvements by challenging alumni student-athletes and friends to make gifts to name the stadium field for **Dr. Herb Appenzeller**, an authority on sport law and risk management and a former athletic director and coach at the college.

**HEAD COACH KEVIN KIESEL:** **Kevin Kiesel (KEE-sul)** took over for **Mike Ketchum '78** in March 2005 as the Quakers' head football coach. Ketchum moved into an administrative role in Guilford's athletic department the preceding December before resigning shortly thereafter to become the defensive coordinator at Division II Winston-Salem State.

Kiesel owns a 68-64-1 record in 12-plus seasons as a head coach. He spent the past four years at Division II Millersville after building non-scholarship winners at Division I-AA Fairfield (1996-2000) and Division III Albright (1993-95). He inherited an 0-10 team at Albright and moved on three years later after the Lions went 8-3 and won the 1995 ECAC Southwest title game. Kiesel started Fairfield's program from scratch in 1996 and went 24-6 in his final three years. Kiesel, a Pennsylvania native, is a 1981 Gettysburg College graduate and has made assistant-coaching stops at Navy, Kentucky, Fordham, Temple, West Chester and Gettysburg.

**QUAKERS IN THE PROS:** Former Guilford All-American receiver **Junior Lord** continued his professional career as a receiver/linebacker for the Las Vegas Gladiators of the Arena Football League last spring. Lord caught 22 passes for 224 yards and four touchdowns in an injury-plagued campaign. He has played the last five seasons in the AFL.

Lord, the Quakers' all-time leading receiver, spent lengthy NFL preseason stints with Washington (1998), Green Bay (2000) and Detroit (2002). He played with the Chicago Enforcers of the XFL in 2001 and spent the 2000 season with the Amsterdam Admirals of NFL Europe. Lord played on Washington's 1998 practice squad and spent the final third of the 1999 campaign on Pittsburgh's practice team. He completed his brilliant career as a third-team All-American in 1997 with 10 school records and six ODAC marks.

**Chris McKinney '03** played with the South Georgia Wildcats of the Arena Football League2 last spring as a receiver and linebacker. He caught 65 passes for 708 yards and 17 touchdowns in 14 games on offense and led the team with 42 total tackles. McKinney earned First Team All-America honors as a Guilford punt returner in 2001.

Former Guilford defensive back and kick returner **Tony Womack '92** is also playing professionally, but in another sport. Womack made his Major League Baseball debut in 1993 and plays with the New York Yankees, his sixth major-league team. He played on the Arizona Diamondbacks' 2001 World Series champions and the St. Louis Cardinals' 2004 World Series runners up. Womack played football at Guilford in 1990 and ranked fifth among NCAA Division III kickoff return leaders.

**QUAKERS PICKED SIXTH IN THE ODAC:** Four-time defending conference champ Bridgewater earned six of seven first-place votes and the top spot in the preseason ODAC Football Coaches' Poll. Guilford was picked sixth. Hampden-Sydney earned the remaining first-place vote and was picked second. Emory & Henry (3rd), Randolph-Macon (4th) and Randolph-Macon (5th) were also picked ahead of Guilford. Catholic brought up the rear in seventh, one point beneath the Quakers.

**GUILFORD ON THE AIR AND ON THE INTERNET:** For the 11th consecutive season, Guilford's football games are broadcast in North Carolina's Piedmont Triad on WGOS (1070-AM). Guilford has also entered into an agreement with SportsJuice.com to carry the contests live over the Internet in 2005. Veteran play-by-play man **Tom Bryant** and his team of broadcasters call the action. Broadcasts begin 15 minutes before kickoff.
