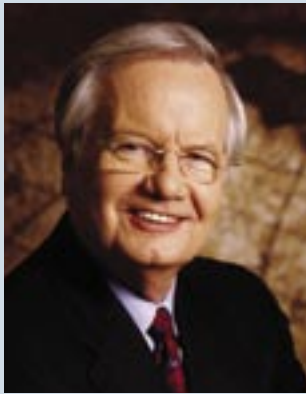


## Bill Moyers Speaks on "Religion and the Environment" March 13 in Bryan Series

Award-winning broadcaster Bill Moyers will present the final Bryan Series lecture of the academic year March 13: "Moyers on America: Religion and the Environment." The talk, rescheduled from March 14, is at 8 p.m. at War Memorial Auditorium.

Moyers is a reporter and commentator on contemporary history, a gifted storyteller through words and images who reveals the spiritual, emotional and historical sides of American culture through his films and books.

Along with his wife, Judith, he has produced hundreds of hours of programming including "Joseph Campbell and the Power of Myth," "Amazing Grace" and "Genesis." His books include the 1971 bestseller *Listening to America* and the 2004 book *Moyers on America: A Journalist and His Times*.

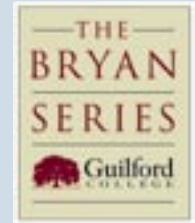
In a broadcast career spanning more than 30 years, Moyers was senior news analyst for the "CBS Evening News," and chief correspondent for "CBS Reports." He hosted a PBS news maga-

zine, "NOW with Bill Moyers," for three years through December 2004.

He was deputy director of the Peace Corps in the Kennedy Administration and special assistant to President Lyndon Johnson from 1963-67, including two years as White House press secretary. A native of Oklahoma, Moyers is an ordained Baptist minister.

## Amy Tan, Author of *The Joy Luck Club* and Other Books, Visits March 30

Bestselling author Amy Tan will present "The Opposite of Fate: An Evening with Amy Tan" March 30 at 8 p.m. at Dana Auditorium. Admission is free to the event, which is sponsored by the Friends of the Guilford College Library and the Freeman Asian Studies Grant.

Tan is the author of the internationally bestselling novel *The Joy Luck Club*,

which was a finalist for the National Book Award, has been translated into 36 languages, including Chinese, and has been made into a major motion picture.

Her latest book, *Saving Fish from Drowning*, was released last fall, and she is the author of *The Kitchen God's Wife*, *The Hundred Secret Senses*, *The Bonesetter's Daughter* and two books for children.

In her non-fiction book, *The Opposite of Fate*, Tan reflects on her upbringing with Christian faith on her father's side and Chinese fate on her mother's, and finds good and bad luck in all corners of her life. Ultimately, she says, "a higher power knows the next move and ... we are at the mercy of that force."

In her off-hours, Tan is also the lead singer for the Rock Bottom Remainders, a rock band made up of fellow writers, including Stephen King and Dave Barry. The group makes select appearances in support of literacy programs for children.

## Ralph Levering to Give Inaugural Fleming Lecture March 22

Davidson College History Professor Ralph Levering will deliver the inaugural James L. Fleming Lecture on Peace and International Law: "Can Committed Citizens Strengthen Global Governance?"

The talk is March 22 at 7 p.m. in the Gallery of Founders Hall and admission is free.

Levering is the author or co-author of eight books, including *The Cold War: A Post-Cold War History*, *Debating the Origins of the Cold*

*War: American and Russian Perspectives*, *Citizen Action for Global Change: The Neptune Group and Law of the Sea*, *The Kennedy Crises: The Press, the Presidency, and Foreign Policy* and *The Public and American Foreign Policy, 1918-1978*.

Levering's parents were world peace advocates who tended an apple orchard near Mount Airy, N.C. Sam Levering, a Quaker, and Miriam, a Methodist-turned-Quaker, were involved with the World Federalist movement from the 1930s to the 1950s and helped

craft the Law of the Sea Treaty.

The lecture was endowed through a bequest of James Fleming, who taught French at Guilford from 1930-35 and died in 1995.
