SAT/ACT Optional: In lieu of SAT I or ACT scores, you may choose to submit a personal portfolio. Your portfolio should reflect your academic, creative and personal interest and accomplishments. In addition, students are responsible for scheduling an interview with a member of the admission staff or with a Guilford College alum.

Withholding SAT I or ACT scores will not prejudice your chances for admission.

NOTE: Students who opt to apply using standardized test scores are also welcome to submit personal portfolios to supplement their applications, if they so desire.
